Study abroad: International College Day shows how

(Hamburg, 10 September 2014) Interested in spending a semester, a short-term or even a full course of studies away from home? The International College Day is Germany's largest independent education fair for English-speaking studies abroad. On Wednesday, 24 September (14:00-17:00) the CollegeCouncil will organize the fifth edition of the fair on the premises of the International School of Hamburg (ISH). Interested pupils and students from Hamburg and the surrounding region are cordially invited. Entry is free of charge, but registration on www.collegeday.de is kindly requested.

More and more students want to gather valuable experiences abroad. But how do they find the right offer? Pupils, students and parents will find answers at the International College Day. The annual fair takes place in several German cities and is free of charge.

It offers first hand information, useful brochures, application forms, a chance to compare offers and – first and foremost – the opportunity to clarify important questions in person. Renowned universities and colleges from the U.S. (e.g. New York University), Canada (University of British Columbia), Great Britain (e.g. University of St. Andrews), Ireland, The Netherlands, Spain, Italy, Switzerland and Austria will be among the approx. 35 exhibitors. Various lectures will round off the fair's program.

The College Day will be held at ISH for the first time - a benefit for ISH students, who are systematically informed and advised about their school and university careers as of grade 9. "We are very pleased with our cooperation with the CollegeCouncil. During the fair, interested pupils and students from Hamburg and beyond have a chance to gain attractive insights into the various opportunities for studying abroad. With its international-mindedness and English as teaching language, our school is an ideal fit", Head of School Andreas Swoboda explains.

The Berlin-based, independent and non-profit CollegeCouncil has been involved in international educational exchanges since 2003. It offers diverse opportunities for students, pupils, graduates, professionals and trainees to study or work abroad, mainly in Englishspeaking countries.

50 nations currently visit ISH. They are divided into the Early Childhood Centre (age 3 to 5), Junior School (grade 1 to 5) and Secondary School (grade 6 to 12). About 100 highly qualified teachers from all over the world support them on their way to the International Baccalaureate (IB Diploma), which enables them to enter leading national and international universities.
